

Methodology







- A number of questions were placed on the Amárach Research July 2023 omnibus. The online omnibus is a syndicated survey whereby clients can include questions within the survey.
- The questions were pre-agreed with the **Banking & Payments Federation**Ireland.
- A total sample of 1,200 adults 18+ was achieved using a combination of quota controls and weighting to ensure the final sample is aligned with the national population in terms of gender, age, region and social grade.
- Survey fieldwork took place from the 18th to 20th July 2023.


A note on reporting: percentages may not add up to 100% due to rounding.

Sample Profile – nationally representative of ROI 18+










Nearly two-thirds (63%) of the adult population are homeowners, and one-quarter (24%) are renters. A smaller proportion (12%) are currently living with friends or relatives.

The current housing situation varies significantly by age. Those aged 35+ are more likely to be homeowners/occupiers, whilst under 35s are more likely to be renting from a private landlord or living with friends and family.



The proportion who expect to be renting from a private landlord or living with friends/family in Ireland reduces over time. The proportion who expect to be homeowners with a mortgage stays the same, whereas the proportion who expect to be homeowners without a mortgage increases as they look ahead to the next 5/10 years.




^{*}Amongst owner occupiers with a mortgage, 17% expect to own without a mortgage five years from now, increasing to 31% in ten years from now.

Nearly half of all non-homeowners (48%) believe it will be up to 10 years before they buy their own home. Nearly three in 10 (29%) want to own a home but don't think they ever will.



Summary



- Nearly two-thirds of the adult population are homeowners (63%), and one-quarter are renters (24%). A smaller proportion are currently living with friends or relatives (12%).
 - Older age groups are more likely to be homeowners/occupiers, whilst under 35s are more likely to be renting from a private landlord or living with friends and family.
- Six in 10 Irish adults (59%) have lived at their current address for more than 10 years, rising to 70% of all owners/occupiers.
- Over half (56%) of the adult population have no plans to move from their current home, rising to 72% of all owners/occupiers.
 - The majority of non-homeowners (59%) plan to live in their current home for up to five years before moving.
- When looking ahead to the next 12 months/ 5 years/ 10 years, some people expect to see changes in their housing situation.
 - The proportion who expect to be renting from a private landlord or living with friends/family in Ireland reduces over time.
 - The proportion who expect to be homeowners without a mortgage or to live outside Ireland increases over time.
 - Interestingly, the proportion who expect to be homeowners with a mortgage remains more or less the same.
- Nearly half (48%) of all non-homeowners believe it will be up to 10 years before they buy their own home. Almost three in 10 (29%) want to own a home but don't think they ever will.
 - Under 35s are more optimistic about buying a home within the next 10 years (63%).
 - A significant proportion of non-homeowners aged 35-44 and 45+ want to own a home but don't think they ever will (40% and 50% respectively).
- For three in five homeowners (60%), this is the first home they have owned either on their own or with someone else.
